**Tax sitting dates and time** – Sabrina Bowman will be in the Borough office to collect real estate tax payments on **April 8<sup>th</sup>** from 9-12 noon, **April 9<sup>th</sup>** from 5-8 pm & **April 12<sup>th</sup>** from 1-4 pm.

**Playground Rules** – Please help keep the park, playground and ball field area clean and safe for residents by observing the following:

- ♣ No dogs/pets allowed
- ♣ No weapons of any kind are allowed
- ♣ No vandalism
- ♣ No smoking, alcohol or drug use
- ♣ Clean up all trash and use provided trash receptacles

**Annual Community Yard Sale** will be held on June 4<sup>th</sup> through June 6<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. A second Community Yard Sale will be held on August 6<sup>th</sup> through August 8<sup>th</sup> (8-5 pm). Please remember to remove all yard sale signs once the sale is over.

**Fireworks** – State law prohibits the use of fireworks within 150 feet of an occupied structure. **Residents are strictly prohibited to set off fireworks at the ballfield & playground.** Residents who see someone using fireworks in an unsafe location should video record the activity & call police immediately.

**Trash collection and recycling**– Penn Waste collects trash on Monday's (recycle bins & trash) and Thursday's (1 large item & trash). Please have all trash out the night before or early in the morning and contain all loose trash so it doesn't blow into the street. Remember that if the Monday trash collection falls on a holiday then trash pickup that week will be delayed by one day so trash will be collected on Tuesday and Friday.

**Garbage cans are to be removed from the sidewalk at the end of the day.** Recycle containers are available at the Borough office. Also, Penn Waste cannot accept any electronics (computers, keyboards, tv's etc.) or appliances. Residents can dispose of electronics and appliances at the York Co Solid Waste Authority Facility. **Effects of Pollution on your Sewer bill** - A portion of your sewer bill pays for upkeep and repairs to wastewater treatment plants and sewer lines. Wastewater is used water. It includes substances such as human waste, food scraps, oils, soaps and chemicals. In homes, this includes water from sinks, showers, bathtubs, toilets, washing machines and dishwashers.

Treatment plants treat water to reduce and remove pollutants in wastewater to a relatively clean and safe level for people and wildlife. Much of the water used by homes, industries, and businesses must be treated before it is released back to the environment.

You can do simple things to reduce pollution which then decreases the amount of polluted water that treatment plants have to treat. The following are just a few examples:

Clean up after your pet. Pet waste left on the ground gets carried into streams by storm water and pollutes the water with bacteria, parasites and viruses that are harmful to people and wildlife.

Don't flush "unflushable" items such as baby and adult wipes, feminine products, rags, paper towels, cat litter, cigarette butts, bandages, diapers, Q-tips or unused medicine. Flushing these items down the toilet will not only pollute the water but will also cause damage to sewer lines.


Take care of fluids that are leaking from your car. Vehicles that drip fluids such as oil, grease, gasoline, antifreeze and brake fluids contribute to polluting the water because the fluids gets washed into the water system by rain water. Dispose of fluids by taking them to an auto store to be recycled. Oil and other petroleum

products are toxic to people, wildlife and plants. Used motor oil is the largest single source of oil pollution in our lakes, streams and rivers. Americans spill 180 million gallons of used oil each year into our waters.

By reducing pollutants, waste water treatment plants can work more efficiently and will have fewer repair costs to equipment.

Greetings Windsor Borough Residents,

This forum will be for the benefit of Windsor Borough residents and property owners, to keep you abreast of matters of interest within the Borough, sharing information regarding Ordinance requirements you may not be aware of and keeping you in the loop with regard to upcoming events, projects and frequent inquiries or concerns often brought to the attention of Borough officials.

1. **STREET SWEEPING:** The annual street sweeping project is scheduled for **Wednesday April 22 and Thursday April 23**. The Borough provides this service as a courtesy to residents in an effort to remove the significant dirt, gravel and debris collected over the course of the winter months. Signs will be posted in advance along all streets affected, and the Borough requires that all vehicles be removed from the streets being swept for the short duration of time noted on the signs. While we understand this may be a minor inconvenience, we ask that you be considerate to the many residents who appreciate the appeal of clean streets. Vehicles that are not moved will be cited and/or towed at the owner's expense.
2. **DUMPSTERS/PODS:** Many are still not aware that a permit is required for use of a dumpster or POD. Secure a permit application at the Windsor Borough website or at the office prior to setting a dumpster or POD. There is no charge for a permit provided it is removed within 14 days.
3. **GRASS/WEED MAINTENANCE:** Once again, it's time to put away the shovels and snow blowers and bring out the lawn mowers and weed eaters. Please be considerate of the many residents who show pride in their properties and maintain yours in compliance with the Property Maintenance Ordinance. And please do not neglect the unsightly weeds that grow out of the sidewalks, around the perimeters of your yards and along your fences!
4. **OPEN BURNING:** Windsor Borough Council has now passed Ordinance # 1-2025 which regulates all open burning in the Borough. With the exception of gas grills used for food cooking, all open burning requires a permit. Prior to engaging in any open burning, please secure a permit application from the Borough Office. This is for the safety of all Borough residents and properties and will be strictly enforced.
5. **BUILDING PERMITS:** As we enter into another season when home projects are common, please remember to notify the Borough Office, or Code/Zoning Enforcement Officer prior to the onset of any significant project where proper permitting may be necessary. While many home projects will not require a permit, there are many that do, and you are urged to communicate your intentions prior to the start of any project in order to remain in compliance with all Borough Ordinance requirements. Permit applications are easy to obtain on the Borough website or at the Borough Office.
6. **POOLSAFETY:** Windsor Borough adheres to the PA State Pool Safety regulations that require a 4' barrier with a self-closing gate around any pool 2' deep or above, which includes temporary/inflatable style pools. The only exemption to this requirement is 4' above ground pools where the wall of the pool serves as the 4' barrier and safety regulations then apply to use and storage of the ladders. 7. **PET OWNERS** are required to carry a bag and clean up after their pets while walking them, and yards must be cleaned up of pet waste on a daily basis. This will be even more important with warmer weather returning to prevent the overwhelming stench of pet waste. This is simple courtesy that should be extended to your neighbors.
8. **UNREGISTERED/UNINSPECTED/JUNK VEHICLES:** Per the Windsor Borough Property Maintenance Ordinance # 5-2017, all motor vehicles parked along any Borough street, alley or on any private property must be current with license, registration and inspection. Vehicles not in compliance must be stored inside an enclosed garage. While the Borough has, and will continue to show leniency in the case of short-term situations, there are many vehicles throughout the Borough that have sat dormant for months, or even years, and create a very unsightly or abandoned appearance and become a shelter for vermin and other unwanted wildlife. The Borough reserves the right to tow such vehicles at the owner's expense. Vehicles such as this should be removed without further delay to avoid enforcement action.
9. **RESERVING OF PARKING SPACES:** All parking spaces throughout Windsor Borough are considered "public parking." Reserving spaces with use of cones, chairs or any other objects is NOT permitted. The Borough retains the right to remove and dispose of any objects placed on parking spaces, and repeated offenses may result in further enforcement actions.
